All proceeds for the yearling's sale on March 10 will go towards the fund, while APTS is also waiving its fees. The only money from the sale not going to the club will be GST.

The Terang Harness Owners, Trainers and Supporters Group has been fundraising \$2M for about four years too build a new stabling facility.



HELPING TERANG STABLE UPGRADE

Yabby Dam Farms is supporting a \$2 million grass roots bid to build new stables at Dalvui Raceway through the proceeds of the sale of a Used To Me yearling at APTS on March 10,

What is the venture? The Terang Harness Owners, Trainers and Supporters Group has been fundraising for about four years and has nearly reached its goal to fund the stables' construction.

Group committee member and trainer of Victorian Horse of the Year Jilliby Kung Fu Marg Lee said "current horse stalls are not up to standard" and the group plans to build a new stabling facility

in conjunction with the Terang Harness Racing Club with provision for up to 100 horse stalls and four horse washes.

"The complex will be completely undercover with a walkway through the middle based on the Melton model. The horse stalls will be similar to Menangle with ample room for horse and sulky.

Terang HRC manager Mark Roberts said as part of the upgrade the old Silks Room, which was part of the complex, would be upgraded with kitchen facilities that would also serve as a community hub and could be used by outside groups for other activities. **VIDEO**

YEARLING PROCEEDS FOR FUND

This stunning chestnut colt is going under the hammer as Lot 14 of the APTS on March 10 with proceeds going to the Terang Stable Upgrade.

By the successful French sire Used To Me out of My Dreamweaver, he is the fifth foal with all four elder siblings being winners,

These include the 10-win mare **MY CHIMERA** (T1.55.6, \$63,360) including two wins at 3, 6 metropolitan wins and a second placing in a Need For Speed heat, running fourth in the Gp1 final.

CADENAS AMOUR (TR1.58.3, \$16,970) has won three of her 17 starts with 4 placings, including a win at 3 and also running 4th in a Breeders Crown heat.

His 2YO older brother **DREAM OVER** has also had a win in his first three juvenile starts.

Lot 14 is eligible for the Vicbred \$7000 First Win Bonus, Vicbred Platinum and Breeders Crown.

BRED TO BE GOOD

Dam **MY DREAMWEAVER** won 4 races and placed 10 times taking a time of 1.57.8TT.

A New Zealand bred mare with pure American bloodlines, she is by Lindy Lane out of the imported mare Dreamlands Nancy.

My Dreamweaver is a half to Gp2 winner **OUR DREAMLOVER** (Love You) (TR1.59.6, \$159,017) who won 16 races, including 9 at 3, the winner of a repechage of the Breeders Crown, and 2nd in the Gp1 Vic Derby, 3rd Gp2 Breeders Crown. Aged winner of Gp2 Qld Cup.

Also half to Ararat Cup winner **CROWN DREAM** (Tr1.59.7, \$50,140) won 9 races, including 2 at 2, and five other winners.

USED TO ME

Haras des Trotteurs resident stallion Used To Me produced his first Australian winner when Chateaubriant beat home his two stablemates in a 3YO race at Bendigo recently.

In just his third start, Chateaubriant came with a determined burst to win in a 2.02.9MR.

The colt is from the first experimental crop of five foals Used To Me sired in Australia, three of which started as 2YOs.

That first crop included NZ Oaks Winner Commander Jewel's trial winning filly, Command Me who was one of two Australasian Breeders Crown 2YO finalists alongside another 2YO trial winner Imsetto who had had five race placings in top Australian 2YO company and has recently resumed as a 3YO.

After seeing how he stamped his foals with his perfect conformation, and that they all just want to trot from day one, Yabby Dam Farms had no hesitation in sending some of their top mares to his court in recent seasons. These included Mybrotherwasastar (dam of Group1 winners Wilma's Mate

and Amour de Fere), which is now a 2YO filly and among the dozen which he served last season were Pretty Peggy Sue (dam of two Gp 1 winners, Kinvara Sue and Pretty Majestic) and Royal Treat, a young Gp1 winner and grand daughter of La Coocharacha, who had three winners on the same day last week.

LOVE YOU

France's premier Winter Meeting, was dominated by Love You's champion daughter Belina Josselyn, who captured two legs of the French Triple Crown by becoming the first mare in 20 years to win the Prix d'Amerique (2670m, middle distance) and then winning Prix de Paris (4000m, staying).

This gave her the complete set having picked up the sprint leg, the Prix de France (2100m) last year while very close relative Uza Josselyn (Love You) was second in this year's Prix de France.

Blessed with an almost perfect action, the chestnut mare has now won €2,284,930.

And in a coup for Haras des Trotteurs, the second horse home in the Prix d'Amerique was Looking Superb, a Norwegian-bred son of our premier sire Orlando Vici.

LEGENDARY STATUS

Love You is quietly gaining legendary status as a sire achieving, something that only one other has done recently.

The great sires are almost all on the honours roll of the Prix d'Amerique including US supersires Volomite, Scotland, Peter Volo, Star's Pride, Hoot Mon, Speedy Count, Bonefish and Speedy Crown, the best French sires Kairos such as Intermede, Vikings Way, Ura, Patara and modern Swedish sires, Viking Kronos and Super Arnie all producing winners of the legendary race.

Love You with two winners (Belina Josselyn, Royal Dream) joins three others in Ready Cash (Ready Express, Bold Eagle), Kairos (Gelinotte, Hairos II), Kerjacques (Eleazar, Toscan)

Love You has also sired the dams of a Prix d'Amerique winner (Bold Eagle) joining Buvetier d'Aunou, Viking Kronos, Speedy Crown, Bonefish, Kairos and Intermede in doing the double.

But only Love You and Kairos have sired TWO Prix d'Ameriques AND the dam of a winner.

SALES

Haras des Trotteurs stallions top sales

Vendors with progeny by Haras des Trotteurs stallions stopped the New Zealand Bloodstocks trotting only sale, with the top two lots and four out of the seven highest priced yearlings.

Trainer Greg Hope signed off for the sale topper, a colt he described as the spitting image of Monbet and paid \$105,000 to secure a close relation to his champion trotter.

The colt is by Monbet's sire, Love You, and from Diedre's Jewel – a Monarchy relative to the multiple group 1 winner.

Hope said he simply had to have the trotter when he saw so much of Monbet in lot 192.

The stock of Love You were the hottest property at Monday's sale.

The French sire headed the sires table with a leading average of \$40,350 and leading aggregate of \$403,500.

Those strong results helped contribute to buyers outlaying more than \$1.2million at New Zealand Bloodstock's first trotters yearling sale.

"He was the spitting image of Monbet at the same age and he is a three-quarter to him, so we really liked him."

Hope has plenty more of the same family at home and they are showing him plenty of promise, so he was keen to snap up more of the same bloodlines.

"We have got a three-quarter blood sister to him that we really like." "She is by Love You from The Earth Moves, who is a full sister to the mother of this yearling and we really like her."

Lot 105 was the only yearling to crack the 100k mark at Tuesday's sale.

Hope bought another yearling from the Monbet family earlier in the sale.

He outlaid \$35,000 for a Love You colt from the Continentalman mare, Sunny Kash.

Monbet appears much further back in lot 180's pedigree than Lot 192.

Winton breeder Michelle Caig's Love You colt from Sun Mist went to Australia, being purchased by E & M Stride for \$90,000.

Australian buyers were active at the sale as they were at Auckland on Monday securing four of the top ten lots, including Chris Lang going to \$51,000 for Haras des Trotteurs stallion Orlando Vici's half-brother to Stent.
